Solution: We created a comprehensive packet that went over not only basic college information but also information specific to the department itself. This packet was updated every semester and made onboarding simple.





MailChimp Newsletter

Format: Mailchimp

Obstacle: The United Staff of Columbia College had a long-outdated newsletter that was a PDF email attachment. It was filled with irrelevant information and poorly designed. This led to a decline in member interaction and reach.

Solution: I used Mailchimp to create and manage a digital newsletter. I created a consistent banner design and filled it with relevant information that members wanted. Moving it to Mailchimp helped track member analytics, archive union files, and store member's contact information.



Before and after pictures of each property show the dedicated work he and his team puts in. "There's never any doubt how different it looks when done," says Lance. "Usually the place doesn't look like the same yard or the same field. The personality completely changes when we're done with it."

Lance worked as a Janitor at Relay for four years and recently transferred to Landscaping. His strong work ethic was apparent, though he says his hypervigilance made indoor work more stressful. The move to Landscaping has allowed him to thrive in his work while maintaining his focus. He enjoys being outdoors and the variety of work that landscaping provides, "I've gotten over thinking I need to identify as my job," says Lance. "What I ought to be doing is trying to do what I want to do as best as I can. You know, like basically what MLK said. Do whatever you're going to do the best you can. Whatever you are, just do the best of that, that you can."

Nora Timmerman, Word Processor at the Federal Highway Administration, appreciates the openness to express their feelings at work. "I'm more confident in being able to actually say, 'Hey, I need help. Because I've always had problems with that, but being able to say, hey I need help is a very freeing thing," says Nora. "It's hard to ask questions of your supervisors and stuff because at a lot of places. It's normally a very: do your stuff, keep your head down, don't talk, get your stuff done and leave type of environment, but I've noticed that at Relay it's very much a community environment."

Nora, who has anxiety and depression, gained confidence in their work. After finishing a data entry project last year, the manager said that it was some of the best work they had seen. "She was really impressed at how fast and detailed it got done," says Nora, "and that makes me feel good that I did my job correctly."

Obstacle: Create a design package for Industry Night, an annual event where industry professionals visit the department to meet graduating students and see their portfolios.


